Tuition/Housing

JIMI 2014 will be held Tuesday, January 20 through Tuesday, January 27. Tuition of \$700 for SEMC and other regional members, \$750 for non-members includes all materials, some continental breakfasts, refreshment breaks, and the awards banquet.

Single room rates are approximately \$90-110/per night, and suites are approximately \$125/per night, including taxes. There is no additional charge for double occupancy.
